Read the following passage and then answer the questions that follow.

##### **Abbey**

I was pleasantly surprised!

4. How long did Abbey have to study to be a hairdresser? [2]
5. What qualification did Abbey get once she had completed her studies? [2]
6. What do you think of hairdressing as a career? Describe your thoughts. [3]
