

Grade 7 English Worksheet

Assessment Task: Word Game - "Bingo"

1. *Play a Word Game*

Read all the questions in class beforehand.

BINGO – Find a person who can answer “yes” to any statement / question and write down the person’s name in the appropriate square. (You may not have the same person answer more than one question.)

You may have to change the pronouns to suit some of the questions, e.g. Do **you** love the sea? First to finish wins.

Have you ever swum in a river?	Are you an only child?	I have never made my bed.	I have not been absent from school this year.	I love the sea.	I love vegetables.
I have a pink toothbrush.	Is your birthday in June?	I am scared of the dark.	My favourite holiday is in the bush.	I have climbed on the roof.	I don't have a cell phone.
