- **centre around** or **centre on** *phrasal verb* If something **centres around** a person or thing or **centres on** them, that person or thing is the main feature or subject of attention EG *the workers' demands centred around pay and conditions.*
- **central** *adj* Something that is central is in the middle of a place or area. EG *The houses* are arranged around a central courtyard.
- **centrally** adv EG The pin is centrally positioned on the circle.
- centralise verb centralises, centralising, centralised; To centralise a country or state means to create a system of government in which one central group of people gives instructions to regional groups. EG We believe in a strong centralised state. centralisation EG large-scale technology brings centralisation.
