1	30	<p>1. It is a property right✓ that exists on works✓ and items✓ created. It protects the rights and interests of the creator. ✓ [4]</p> <p>2. Artists and people who have created works and items will make their money from the sale of those items. Copyright protects their rights and allows them to earn money from what they created. It is especially difficult to earn money from creations of the mind – such as ideas and literary works. Copyright exists to protect these ownership rights.✓✓✓✓ [4]</p> <p>3. Literary, dramatic, artistic, musical, film, sound recordings, broadcasts, books, pamphlets – anything that has been created in the mind and made into a tangible form.✓✓✓✓ [4]</p> <p>4. Because the artist/s that composed and/or performed the music own the rights to CD. You cannot copy and sell it. You are, in effect, stealing their work.✓✓✓✓ [4]</p> <p>5. No. You would be stealing the intellectual property of the authors.✓✓ [2]</p> <p>6. To copy and pass off the writing of others as your own, not to acknowledge the source of written material. ✓✓✓✓ [4]</p> <p>7. The copyright holders can sue you. No. Once you have created the work in a tangible form (book, artwork, piece of music, etc), you hold the exclusive right to that work. 3	20	<p>3.1 SAMRO = South African Music Rights Organisation. ✓✓ DALRO = Dramatic and Literary Rights Organisation. ✓✓ These are two organisations in South Africa that hold the literary and performance rights of music ✓ and plays/literary works for the authors. ✓ If you want to perform items, you need to apply to these organisations who will then charge you a rate to perform.✓✓ The money is then forwarded to the holder of the copyright. These are known as royalties.✓✓ [10]</p> <p>Solomon Linda composed the world famous song “The Lion Sleeps Tonight” or “Wimoweh” or “Mbube” as it is variously known. ✓✓ He was a migrant worker ✓ and was unaware of his rights. ✓ He signed away his rights to the music and other people have become rich on his composition, but he died a poor man. ✓✓ This serves as a caution for</p>
