- ✓ Preferably have obtained a minimum of 70% in English and Mathematics or Sciences in Grade 11
- ✓ Be a South African citizen under the age of 21 in 2026
- ✓ Demonstrate financial need (Typically a family income of less than R600 000 per annum)¹
- ✓ Meet the minimum entrance requirements for their chosen field of study
